

Attendance

Evidence shows that there is a strong correlation between good attendance and good attainment in schools. Last school year we fell just short of our school target of 96%, largely due to a spate of chickenpox. This year so far we have an average of nearly 98% which is brilliant!

Of course the vast majority of absence is unavoidable due to illness and we do seem to have one or two bugs going round at the moment. Please can I remind you of the policy that children need to stay off school until they have a clear 48 hours from the last bout of sickness or diarrhoea to avoid passing it on to others. I understand that these messages might sound slightly contradictory but health comes first and avoiding passing infection on to others will benefit attendance over all. In school we are insisting on regular hand washing with soap and warm water and I know as ever you will support this message at home

Talk to the Teacher

In the mornings and especially at the end of the day teachers make a point of coming onto the playground to make themselves available for parents. Please do make use of the opportunity to ask or tell them anything that you feel doesn't need a longer or more private appointment.
